### We continue to pray for our Seminarians

Anh Tuan Nguyen, Rene De Los Reyes & Richard Webster

We pray in particular for **Rene De Los Reyes**, who will be ordained as a Deacon on Monday 16th February in London. Yesterday, 14<sup>th</sup> February, **Bishop Richard Moth** was consecrated as Archbishop of Westminster. Bishop Richard is well known in this diocese as an oblate of Pluscarden Abbey and the former Bishop of Fr John Allen.

**This week** we heard the very sad news that Justyna Tymecka died after a long illness. Justyna was a wonderful person and extremely prayerful, often spending hours in prayer on her own in church. She was also very generous, providing a lot of the fresh flowers on display, paying for the renovation of the statue of Our Lady at the rear entrance, the crucifix and the St Joseph statue in the Marian room and the refurbishment of the large St Joseph statue in the church. Having suggested that she choose a patron saint to pray for her in her final weeks, Justyna chose Blessed Anne Catherine Emmerich, hence the special request for prayer as few weeks ago. And she died ...on Blessed Anne Catherine's feast, 9<sup>th</sup> February, a sign that Justyna is on her way quickly to Heaven. Although Justyna is being buried in Poland, it is important that we remember her here at St Mary's. A Memorial Mass will be said at 1pm on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> February, at which Justyna's mother will be present, followed by refreshments in the hall. As a result the morning Mass on that day will be cancelled. .... Also, on 9th February the father of our cleaner Ania and father-in-law of PJ, previously our site manager, died in Poland. Please pray for the repose of Bogdan Sikora's soul too.

**Important health and safety matter:** It has been noticed recently that some parents have been allowing their young children to access the aisle between the extension and the main church during Mass, even playing around the roped off War Memorial area and causing the barriers to fall over. There is a real risk of injury – for which we would be liable - and damage to one of our original, very fragile stained-glass windows. Similarly, it is not a good idea to allow children to play around the candle stand at St Joseph's statue. With lit candles, there is a danger of being burnt, or were the candle stand to be pulled over, a more serious risk of permanent scarring or fire. Please ensure that children are closely supervised at all times and remember that there is the children's liturgy during the first part of the Mass!

**Defibrillator** – We are delighted that just over £2,000 has been raised through very generous donations to cover the cost of purchasing a defibrillator, together with the cost of installation and training of personnel in the use of it. Having experienced a member of the congregation suffering a cardiac arrest during Mass in a previous parish and the sad experience of Christine Clifford, our former assistant sacristan, it seems obvious that the parish should have ready access to such a life-saving device. For every minute defibrillation is delayed, survival chances drop by up to 10%, so even if an ambulance were to take 5 minutes, a defibrillator would provide a 50% better chance of survival.

**Parish first-aiders** Relatedly, the parish needs to update its list of named first-aiders. We have a number of medical professionals in the parish, so please consider volunteering to ensure that at all Masses, at least on Sundays, there is someone on hand to deal with a medical emergency. Fortunately, such occurrences are very rare, but when they happen, it is vital to have appropriately qualified personnel on hand.
